

- Registration is open to all. COMPETITORS MUST REGISTER
 Online registration is required. (See page 1)
- Registration fees must be paid at time of online registration. Please retain a copy for your records.
- All applications for class entry must be received by 30 September 2016.
- Accepted competitors will be notified by 30 October 2016.
- Reconfirmation of entry by competitor is required by email no later than 8 December 2016.
- Only <u>one</u> entry per competitor will be accepted but please indicate 1st, 2nd and 3rd choices on application form.
- Imposed Classes 11, 14 & 18 require US\$160.00 payment in addition to Registration Fee.
- Mail-in Classes 2 & 17 do not require payment of Registration Fee but are required to pay a Competitors entry Fee of US\$55.00.
- Junior Class 16 is not required to pay the Registration Fee but is required to pay a Competitors entry Fee of **US\$25.00**.
- All exhibits will be staged in artificial lighting.
- Judging will take place from 12:00 17.00 on Wednesday 21 June 2017.
- In addition to Special Awards, prizes will be presented to First, Second and Third in each class.
- The Judges will be available for informal discussions between 08.30 10.00 on Thursday 22 June 2017.

Competitive classes are open to individual exhibitors who are members of a floral art society/national association represented in WAFA.

Class 16: Open to non-WAFA members

Class 20 is open to WAFA and non-WAFA Juniors.

INTERNATIONAL WORLD FLOWER SHOW RULES

- 1. An exhibit is made of plant material, with or without accessories, WITHIN a space specified in the Show Schedule.
- 2. Plant material must predominate over all other components of the exhibit.
- 3. The use of artificial plant material is forbidden unless stated in the regulations.
- 4. Fresh plant material must be in water or water-retaining material unless such material remains turgid throughout the event.
- 5. Painted and/or artificially coloured plant material may be used unless otherwise stated in the regulations.
- 6. PRE-PREPARED WORK MUST NOT PREDOMINATE IN THE EXHIBIT.

STAGING REGULATIONS

Competitors unable to fulfill their commitments must notify the WAFA Barbados Secretariat (email: competitions@wafabarbados.com) in advance of the show. There will be no refund of the Registration Fee or Competition Entry Fee for Imposed, Mail-in Classes or Junior Class.

- All Competitive Classes (except Classes 2, 16 &17 must be staged in situ by the competitor, who must use the specified staging. Attachments to and moving of, the staging is not permitted unless specified in the particular class.
- Competitors may use pre-constructed or pre-woven plant material but it may not be a dominant component of the exhibit. Items requiring special time or expertise for their preparation may be brought ready assembled for incorporation in any exhibit, but may not dominate.
- Competitors' badges MUST be worn at all times.
- Only competitors and officials will be allowed in the halls during staging times.
- Staging time for competitive exhibits (except Classes 2 & 17, Imposed Classes 11, 14, & 18, Juniors Class 16 will be strictly enforced from 06.00 11:00 on Wednesday 21 June 2017.
- Imposed Class competitors, Classes 11, 14 & 18 MUST stage their entries from 08.00 11:00.
- Exhibits for Classes 2, 16 & 17 may be pre-posted or hand delivered to the venue, Tuesday 20 June between 17.00 19.00.
 - Information to be supplied when accepted into Class.
- No help may be given regarding preparation or construction of an exhibit (except if required to lift a heavy object, and only then at the discretion of a show official).
- Although every care is taken to ensure accuracy, all measurements in the staging instructions are approximate. All exhibits must be staged within the space provided, using the specified staging, unless otherwise indicated in the schedule. Attachments to and moving of staging is not permitted.
- Competitors must place their waste material in bags provided by the Show Committee and remove it from the hall.
- Aerosol / spray painting is NOT permitted in the halls.
- Competitors wishing to use electrical equipment, please note that the Supply is 110 Volts 50 cycles.
- Competitors may not bring any refreshments into the halls. Light refreshments will be available.
- Judging will be conducted according to the International World Show Rules and Regulations in this schedule.

- No persons other than Judges, their Stewards and Show Officials will be permitted in the halls whilst judging is in progress.
- The decisions of the Judges' Panel are final.
- Competitors are required to maintain their exhibits in prime condition for the duration of the show. Maintenance of exhibits may be carried out from 07.30 08.30 each morning. The Committee reserves the right to change or remove faded plant material.
- All Competitors' property is at their own risk and they must be responsible for their own insurance, if deemed necessary. The Barbados Association of Floral Artists (BAFA) and the World Association of Floral Artists (WAFA) do not accept any liability for loss or damage to any of the competitors' property.
- Dismantling time for all competitors is Sunday 25 June, from 20.30 22.00. To ensure security of competitors and their property, the halls will be vacated completely from 20.00 20:25 except for members of WAFA Barbados Show Committee. Competitors wearing badges will be admitted at 20:30. Any exhibits or parts thereof remaining unattended in the halls after 22.00 will be deemed abandoned and will be disposed of.
- Agreement to the above Regulations is declared by completing the Registration Form.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Plant Suppliers and Plant Importation – *Please see pages 22.* Dried, skeletonized, glycerined, bleached, additionally coloured and manipulated plant material is considered natural.

Definition: Foliage

The leaves of any plant.

Immature, unopened buds NOT showing petal colour.

Flowerless bracts are acceptable but they should NOT predominate in exhibits where there is a requirement to feature foliage.

Also flowerless grasses, equisetum, cacti/succulents, lichens, mosses


This definition may not necessarily be botanically correct but it should be accepted for the purposes of this competitive show.



INTERNATIONAL DEMONSTRATIONS

Demonstration 1 – Thursday 22 June – 18:00 PARADISE GARDEN Craig Bullock: United Kingdom

Craig Bullock, MA, International floral designer and artist was the youngest to ever become a NAFAS National demonstrator at age 24. Over the last 36 years Craig has demonstrated and taught around the globe in countries such as Australia, Barbados, Belgium, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Japan, Kenya, Malta, New Zealand, Pakistan, Russia, South Africa, Spain, and the USA. Craig is also a judge of floral art and his creativity and showmanship have been featured in many books and magazines, primarily the NAFAS magazine "Flower Arranger". Craig enjoys working with natural materials and sees his floral work as an extension of his art work and enjoys challenging ideas whilst respecting tradition. He was included in the organizing team for shows and exhibitions at Chicheley, Oxford, Canterbury and Southwark Cathedrals in 2011, 2013, 2014 and 2015. Craig was awarded several Gold and Best in Show awards at RHS Chelsea, other UK national competitions and international WAFA shows in New Zealand and Glasgow. He gained a BA and MA from Manchester Metropolitan University in 2007 and will take over as Area Chairman of the NAFAS North West Area in November 2017.

Dr. Solomon Leong: Hong Kong

Dr. Solomon Leong is a highly recognized Hong Kong based floral designer. International media, such as the BBC, have described him as "extraordinary" and "striking". Dr. Leong's professional life includes competing in international shows, conducting workshops and contributing regularly to fashion magazines like Elle, Cosmopolitan and Marie Claire in China. He has consistently received several gold, silver, bronze and special awards at international flower shows in China, Japan, Malaysia, Singapore and the UK. Dr. Leong is a doctor of philosophy in cultural studies, which gives him extensive knowledge of cultures and history in relation to floral art. He is a successful commentator of international floral designs on radio and television shows world-wide and also has extensive experience as an international judge. He is director of SOLOMON BLOEMEN Bespoke Floral Design Studio in Hong Kong providing expert floral services for a distinguished clientele. He is a member of the World Flower Council Hong Kong chapter, President of the Hong Kong Flower Club and Chairman of the Hong Kong Association of Flower Arranging Societies. He has published a flower magazine called "Solomon's Blooming Chic" in Chinese.

Demonstration 2 Friday 23 June – 18:00 ENTENTE CORDIALE *Marie Françoise Déprez: France*

An International teacher, demonstrator and judge who runs her own school "Jeux de Fleurs International Floral Art Institute". Madame Déprez uses her social work skills to motivate creativity and style to produce first class floral art. She has travelled widely demonstrating and training in countries like Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Hong Kong, Holland, Ireland, Italy, Japan, New Zealand, Uruguay, U.S.A., Russia, UK and Oman. She has organized and promoted international floral art competitions in Bourg-en-Bresse in 2000, 2003, 2006 and won prizes at flower shows in Monaco, Toronto, Brussels and Paris.

Madame Déprez has authored five books on floral art, namely Passion Florale, Table Design, Jeux de Fleurs, Floral Love and Floral Fantaisie.

William Dixon: United Kingdom

William (Bill) Dixon started his working career as an Interior Designer and continued his own successful business in Lancashire until his recent retirement. However, in the early 1990's he discovered the joy of flower arranging which led him to obtain a City and Guilds qualification in floral art. His love for the art form and his natural creativity carried him on to become a lead designer, NAFAS national demonstrator and teacher in the UK and several countries abroad. Bill was part of the UK North West Area team at Chelsea 2011 and led the RHS Tatton Flower Show team in 2014 achieving gold medals at both of these shows. He has won several other gold medals at National and World Shows, and was part of the design team for Winchester Cathedral's Flower Festival in 2015. He has been selected to be lead designer for Blackburn Cathedral's Flower Festival in 2016.

Title: Barbados – The Gardens of Paradise, Past and Present Lecturer - Professor Sir Henry Fraser

Senator Professor Emeritus Sir Henry Fraser is retired Dean of the Faculty of Medical Sciences and Founding Director of the Chronic Disease Research Centre of the University of The West Indies, Cave Hill Campus, Barbados. He is author of more than 100 medical and scientific papers on medical education, hypertension, obesity, drug treatment, health of the elderly and other subjects, and has been a Sunday columnist for many years, currently writing Things that Matter in the Sunday Advocate. Public Orator, Cave Hill Campus (1992 – 2010) and National Public Orator since 1998.

He has had parallel careers in Architectural History and as writer, artist, public orator and TV presenter, is best known for his many books on Barbados heritage and architecture, TV series Treasures of Barbados and recent series Pillars of Worship and Parliament 375 for CBC-TV. Past President of the Barbados National Trust, he chaired the Task Force for the nomination of Historic Bridgetown and its Garrison as a World Heritage site, and is now Chairman of the Task Force for Preservation of Barbados' Built Heritage and the Barbados National Trust's Sentinel Committee. He was Knighted November 2014.

Title: Gender and Social Change in Post-Independent Barbados Lecturer - Professor Eudine Barriteau, GCM

Professor Violet Eudine Barriteau is a Grenadian born Caribbean feminist, scholar and activist with considerable experience in research, holding senior executive positions and administering and coordinating several regional projects at the University of The West Indies, Cave Hill Campus. She has been awarded many academic scholarships including awards from international universities in Toronto and Sweden as well as national and regional awards.

Professor Barriteau holds a Ph.D. in Political Science from Howard University, and an MPA in Public Sector Financial Management from New York University. She was appointed Principal of The University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus (UWI-CHC) on May 1, 2015, after previously holding positions as first head of the Centre for Gender and Development Studies, Deputy Principal and Principal, Open Campus UWI-CHC, before being appointed to her present post.

Country awards received include the Gold Crown of Merit (GCM) of Barbados for her invaluable contribution to gender and development and the Order of Grenada Gold Award for Excellence. She has written over thirty book chapters and peer-reviewed journal articles. Her research interests include: Caribbean Feminist Thought; Economic Analysis; and Theorizing Gender Systems in the Caribbean Political Economy.

Title: Bajan Folklore

Lecturer - G. Addington Forde

Barbadian Folklorist, Mr. G. Addington Forde, started his career as a teacher of English Literature after completing his tertiary education at the University of the West Indies, Barbados. His love of research in the cultural aspects of Barbados led him to the position of Cultural Officer at the National Cultural Foundation (NCF) specializing in folklore. He co-authored the work "A to Z of Barbadian Heritage", has published many articles on cultural norms, values and practices for the NCF and spoken about these on the local radio

station, the Caribbean Broadcasting Corporation and contributed to the Nation newspaper on subjects such as "Kites", "De Mortar-Pestle: A collection of Barbadian proverbs" and "Folk Beliefs of Barbados". Mr. Forde is also a poetry writer and his features in this genre have also appeared in the Nation newspaper, Bim Magazine and "Voices 1", an anthology of Barbadian Writing.

The multi-talented Mr. Forde has done performances of his work on stage and television both as writer, producer and actor. He has been instrumental in reviving the African board game "Warri" now played in Barbados, Antigua and Barbuda.
